

## Dean Savoca's AV/Room Set Requirements

### AV:

- Projector (Dean brings his own laptop [mac])
- Screen
- Sound amplification for videos (all presentations include video)
  - Large rooms - from the sound board
  - Smaller rooms – speakers
- Wireless lavalier microphone – for Dean
  - Small audiences (under 150) – 1 extra wireless handheld mic for participants
  - Large audiences (more than 150) – 1 or more wireless handhelds with mic handlers or mics on stands for participants
- One high top round table on stage

### Room:

- Crescent rounds preferred
- Please send us a schematic/floor plan of the room
- Table at the back for bonus handouts/giveaway etc.

### Some Topics Require Flipcharts:

- Flipchart/s (preferably Post-It brand with adhesive-backed sheets)
- Several thick Sharpie markers (or equivalent) in various colors
  - **Master the Zone** – one easel and tablet of flipcharts
  - **Be People Smart** – four easels and tablets of flipcharts
  - **Team Alignment sessions** – up to five easels and tablets of flipcharts (depending on the number of participants)
